Good morning Matt,

We have roughly the following, initial projects and estimates for eliminating Sanitary Sewer Overflows and discharges (SSO):

1. 300,000 linear feet of sanitary sewer lining,
2. 200,000 linear feet of sanitary service lead relining or replacement,
3. Rehabilitation and lining of approximately 300 Sanitary Manholes,
4. Rehabilitation of approximately 80 storm sewer manhole structures,
5. Construction of approximately 15,000 linear feet of Storm sewer and related appurtenances,
6. Removal of at least 9 sanitary sewer regulator chambers (all),
7. Replacement and new construction of approximately 20,000 linear feet of sanitary sewer main,
8. Rehabilitation and/or replacement of 20 storm sewer outfall pipe and headwalls, including river slope stabilization,
9. 10 additional years of flow monitoring consultation and data collection,
10. 2,000 storm and sanitary sewer and footer/downspout separations (residential structures),
11. Rehabilitation, construction, and wet-well enhancement of City's Sanitary lift and pump stations.

Approximate cost = 65 million.

City just authorized additional flow meters at our cost to expand our purview of the system. In fact just today we discovered and outfall that we believe can be eliminated this fall. On 11 more to go.

Staff is working full time to better understand our system's shortcomings.

Good afternoon,

TMACOG is in the process of our annual update to the 208 plan, and I would like to check in with you about updates for this year. TMACOG sent the initial request for updates on 5/12/21 and did not receive any updates for this year from the City of Maumee. However, after the 208 public meeting on 9/9/2021, stakeholders brought up the need to update the plan to include information regarding the City of Maumee's disclosure of unreported overflows and plans for abatement. We will update the attached facility planning area descriptions with a summary of the discharge, the City's response, future plans, and estimations of future capital improvements needed to address the issue in the 208 Plan.

I have drafted some language for your review based on the public information on the City's website. Please review and provide feedback by 10/13 so that we can include this information in the 208 2021 update.

Is the description below an accurate timeline for contacting the OEPA? Are there additional steps that should be included here?

City of Maumee contacted the Ohio EPA on July 10, 2020, who responded with its Director's Final Findings and Orders document which outlines resolution requirements. The Director's Final Findings and Orders were approved in final form on July 21, 2021. Maumee estimates that the resolution will take approximately 30 years to complete at a cost in excess of \$100 million, which includes a fine of \$29,936.00 by the Ohio EPA. However, the City wants to make clear that it intends to move aggressively to reduce these overflows, and that the City will report any overflows to Lucas County and the EPA.

Is the outline below a complete list of the plans to move forward in remediating these issues?

- Document a scheduling plan to complete a Sewer System Evaluation Study within 180 days of signing the Ohio EPA Order which was approved by City Council and the EPA on July 21, 2021.
- Within 180 days of July 21, 2021, the City must identify and implement a Public Notification Program: to inform the public of the locations of SSOs; advise the public of SSO occurrences; inform the public of possible health and environmental impacts associated with SSOs; and advise the public against contact recreation when elevated bacterial levels may endanger public health.
- The City must post signs at all SSO locations.
- The City also has 270 days, from July 21, 2021, to submit a SSO Emergency Response Plan (ERP) that identifies measures to protect public health and the environment in the event of an SSO.
- The City must submit, within 1 year of July 21, 2021, a Capacity, Management, Operation, and Maintenance Program (CMOM) for all parts of the sanitary collection system.
- Within 3 years the City shall submit a Sewer System Evaluation Study (SSES) which specifies majors tasks and estimates the time of completion of these tasks.

Additional Questions:

1. Would you like to include information about how these plans work with the existing CSO plan?
2. What are the expected infrastructure costs associated with this plan?

Thank you for taking time to provide additional information. Once the updates have been included in the 208 plan, a copy of the FPA document will be sent and a draft copy can also be found on the TMACOG 208 Plan website page <https://tmacog.org/water/regional-water-quality-plan>.

Governor DeWine Announces Launch of New Water and Wastewater Infrastructure Grant Program

(COLUMBUS, Ohio) – Ohio Governor Mike DeWine today announced the launch of a new grant program that will invest hundreds of millions of dollars in the future of water infrastructure across the state.

The Ohio Water and Wastewater Infrastructure Grant Program, which is part of Governor DeWine's initiative to strategically invest in Ohio's future, is open to public and non-public entities that operate water systems across the state, with emphasis placed on addressing the needs of economically disadvantaged communities.

“It is wrong that there are places in this state where clean water is not readily available, where sewage systems are crumbling, and where much-needed improvements are long overdue,” said Governor DeWine. “Working with our local leaders, we're going to invest in the Ohio communities that need significant infrastructure upgrades to ensure that they have access to clean, safe drinking water and reliable sewer infrastructure.”

The Ohio Water and Wastewater Infrastructure Grant Program will award approximately \$250 million to provide safe, reliable drinking water in areas that lack infrastructure, bring sewage treatment capacity to unsewered areas, and develop regional infrastructure to serve multiple communities.

The Ohio General Assembly funded the grant program in House Bill 168, sponsored by State Representatives Mark Fraizer (R-Newark) and Mike Loychik (R-Bazetta), with money that was appropriated through the American Rescue Plan Act. Governor DeWine signed the bill into law in June.

“Investments in critical infrastructure have long-term benefits for our communities,” said Lydia Mihalik, Director of the Ohio Department of Development. “It will make Ohio more competitive for business development projects, while also improving the quality of life for our residents.”

“This program will make a difference in our communities and in the lives of Ohioans,” said Ohio EPA Director Laurie A. Stevenson. “Many Ohio communities need this assistance to help their water and wastewater infrastructure projects move forward.”

Water and wastewater construction projects are eligible for up to \$5 million in grant funding, and infrastructure engineering design projects are eligible for up to \$250,000. Examples of water infrastructure construction projects include, but are not limited to:

- Sewer/wastewater treatment plant improvements/expansion
- New/replacement sanitary sewer lines
- Excess sanitary sewer infiltration/inflow correction
- Improvements to public drinking water treatment facilities
- Drinking water line improvements or extensions
- Repair, replacement, and construction of drinking water storage towers

The Ohio Department of Development, with support from the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, is administering the Ohio Water and Wastewater Infrastructure Grant Program. The application, program guidelines, and a list of FAQ about the grant process are available at InvestinginOhiosFuture.Ohio.gov. Applications will be accepted until all the funding is depleted.

I wanted to touch base with everyone about Lake Erie Waterkeeper's Executive Order. I've gotten the opportunity to talk with 4 of the 7 Maumee City Council members concerning this initiative. I thank you for being willing to have a discussion and answer a couple questions.

I've just learned that the **City of Sandusky** has also endorsed this initiative along with the **City of Toledo** and the **Lucas County Commissioners!**

Based upon my research so far concerning the agreement that Mayor Carr & Tracey Elmore mentioned that Maumee City Council has concerning not voting on initiatives, I've found the following:

- Based upon my records request concerning an official vote in regards to this matter, I've been told that no one is aware of any official request or agreement
- Based upon my conversations, it seems that the agreement was decided upon concerning social issues. I would not classify the quality of our drinking water to be a social issue

I believe that the City of Maumee should not leave it up to the City of Toledo to deal with the issue of the quality of our drinking water merely because they are from whom we get our drinking water supply. The City of Toledo definitely needs to support this initiative and they are but so should all other municipalities that use Lake Erie water to drink, fish, boat, etc. One of the biggest tributaries into Lake Erie is the Maumee River which flows along the entire southern border of the City of Maumee and is one of the main sources of nutrient overload that causes the algal bloom in the lake at the mouth of the river.

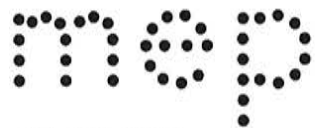
The citizens of Maumee deserve some sort of action from the City of Maumee when it comes to ensuring that another water event like 2014 doesn't happen. The residents should also expect that the city is working to address the root cause of the problem so that the additional costs that residents are paying as a result of the algae aren't for nothing. I've taken a paragraph from the attached documents and included it below to elaborate more on the cost:

“to acknowledge that local government water utilities and their users are paying tens of millions to monitor, treat and acquire capital equipment to address harmful algae and cyanotoxins from the algae, and to acknowledge that local utility wastewater plants are collectively spending billions of dollars to reduce phosphorus discharges and sewage overflows almost all paid by the users. Concurrently, federal and state tax dollars are paying billions for Best Management Practices to reduce agricultural phosphorus runoff with no reporting of phosphorus reductions.”

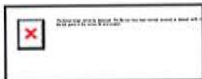

Good morning Mr. Moore,

I understand your frustration and I am willing to discuss the City's actions at a time of your convenience. Please provide a phone number.

First, I want to assure you that NEVER in my career did I ever cut public safety personnel. The information you have is incorrect, or perhaps the dates to which you refer are in error. In the first community I administered we had no police department yet during my tenure we instituted a fully equipped department with over 12 full time equivalent positions. The township provided fire service so there was no need for that jurisdiction to provide its own. The last jurisdiction I worked experienced significant cuts to public safety during the 2008-2010 recession because the City was heavily reliant on an income tax which is highly susceptible to swings in the economy. To be clear, I did not start working for that jurisdiction until 2011, after these cuts were made. However, during my tenure, we increased the number of firefighters by 17% permanently and hired 2 additional police officers. I also want to make sure it is understood that the firefighter ranks saw increases and decreases during my tenure due to writing and being awarded a SAFER grant for a 3 year period to hire 9 additional firefighters for that 3 year period which expired, thus reducing the number as they were specifically grant funded. In any event, we did, as stated above hire 3 additional firefighters permanently when the funds were available in the City's budget to do so.

Regarding reductions in the Police Division; while 5 officer positions were eliminated, (emphasis on positions), only 3 individuals will be reduced, which is unfortunate in any case. I am currently working on a plan that may save these 3 jobs but it will likely take a month or so to solidify the solution if in fact we can pull it off. The move the Mayor made will actually serve to reduce command structure but not reduce the number of police we have patrolling out streets. It was important to the Mayor and Council that if position cuts were necessary, that that pain be shared by reducing the number of managerial positions in the City, which has, in fact happened. This is on top of the positions that were already consolidated when I was hired. When I was hired, The Mayor and City Council reduced two upper level management positions through attrition. The City Administrator position was once combined with the Public Safety Director Position. Then 2 months ago when I started and when the Public Services Director retired, the Administrator took on that role as well. These current reductions require the Administrator to take on an additional two manager position roles which in total are estimated to save the City over at least \$400,000 per year going forward and require the Administrator to work significantly higher number of hours per week than any other staff member which I am more than happy to do. So you can see, eliminating my position would only serve to create a larger reduction in staff elsewhere. I can also assure you that I am an at-will employee and the Mayor and Council can eliminated me at any time for no reason at all which is not the case for anyone else.

Now let's discuss budget. I have some idea what communities that surround Maumee are experiencing in terms of revenue shortfall and at some point those communities will have difficult decisions to make as did we. Their elected officials will most definitely take measures of some kind to reduce the community's

exposure financially. Is Maumee ahead of the curve in terms of fixing it's revenue? Perhaps. However, since we have already witnessed significant reductions in April 2020 income tax receipts as opposed to last year at the same time, it stands to reason we would begin to project for the next 5 months and during the coming year where the City might stand with revenue receipts. Those numbers are grim at best. There are several very qualified individuals that work for the City providing these projections and even they believe the numbers the Mayor and Council used, are not conservative enough. For example, We estimated the **reduction** of income tax receipts for this April to be approximately \$460,000 from this time last year. Unfortunately, the **reduction** we actually realized was \$1.2 million without taking into account the next 4 months of projected reductions.

In all, the City is projected to loose between 2.5 and 3.5 Million this year in lost revenue, which means the City cannot sustain going into the next fiscal year. For that matter, it was going to be difficult for the City to end up this year in balance financially considering the structural operational deficit it already had even without the COVID-19 crisis. There are other City's witnessing far harder choices than Maumee. Sandusky is just one of those communities harder hit.

As clarification, governmental units utilize the phrase "fund balance" instead of 'rainy day fund". In fact, there is no such thing as a rainy day fund other than as a reference for unencumbered, disposable cash. In clarification, fund balance should never be confused with to mean rainy day fund or savings. Fund Balance is merely a phrase that which refers to the amount of funds on hand at any one point during the year, (a "snap shot" of sorts), but, which may already be encumbered (spoken fore), already in the fiscal year budget. It is truly essential that the fund balance not be spent below 15% of the total operating expenditures in any one year due to cash flow considerations and maintaining the City's bond rating, (credit rating), so as not to increase the amount of money the City spends on interest payments during the year. Clearly, a reduced rating can and will likely make it more costly over time for the City to borrow money for things like street projects, fire trucks, and other public safety debt we might incur for building and equipment. The extra interest cost actually exacerbates the income shortfall we are currently experiencing and would result in further cuts and no one wants that.

I also want to clear up some confusion regarding the 19 people to which you refer. There, are in fact 19 positions being downsized. However, it will only result in 16 reduction in force, of which we believe at least 6 are eligible to retire and 2 other through attrition later. The true number is essentially 19 positions, only 16 individuals of which 8 are reduction in force that are not eligible to retire.

The are other cuts that the Mayor's orders complete both for all managerial positions including my own in terms of loss of accrued time, working significant extra hours without compensation etc.

A Note from Abby Buchop, Interim Lucas County EMA Director:

On March 13, 2020, the President declared a national emergency for the COVID-19 pandemic. In accordance with The Stafford Act, eligible emergency protective measures taken to respond to COVID-19 emergency at the direction or guidance of public health officials may be reimbursed under Category B of FEMA's Public Assistance (PA) program. FEMA assistance will be provided at a 75 percent federal cost share. This declaration is limited to costs incurred by state and local government and in very limited circumstances, non-profit organizations, for Category B expenses only: emergency protective measures. Attached is a Fact Sheet regarding Emergency Protective Measures. Loss of revenue and increased operating expenses are not eligible under PA. **It is the responsibility of each jurisdiction to complete the Request for Public Assistance (RPA) process independently.**

Schools, universities and non-profits (other than hospitals) may apply, but entities must demonstrate legal responsibility for emergency protective measures. If an applicant is a private non-profit organization with legal responsibility for protective measures (e.g. hospital), a submit a completed 90-121 PNP Questionnaire (attached) with required documents.

The Public Assistance Program and Policy Guide can be found [here](#). Additional "Tips and Tricks" for navigating FEMA's Public Assistance Program can be found [here](#).

Cost documentation forms can be found [here](#). All forms have summary sheets in the titles. Applicants should document all actions taken in response to COVID-19, including a description of activities. This will allow for proper eligibility determinations.

Potential applicants should email a completed Request for Public Assistance (RPA) to emarecovery@dps.ohio.gov as soon as possible. Please be sure to include a DUNS number. It can be

written anywhere on the RPA document. At least one point of contact on the RPA must have an email. This is required to manage the grant through FEMA's web-based application.

Ohio EMA will be conducting Applicant Briefings and details will be provided when dates are confirmed. Attached is a draft FAQ document that OEMA has provided. As Lucas County EMA receives additional information, we will pass that along to our partners.
