

Chief Donald,

Below is a narrative of my conversations with Mr. Harbal and Ofc. Corbin about the incident during the women's self defense class at Perkins High School.

May 19, 2021

I was contacted by Jeff Harbal about an incident that happened at Perkins High School. Mr. Harbal advised he was approached by a concerned teacher. The teacher explained, Ofc. Corbin was putting on a women's self defense class. Ofc. Corbin brought in a stun gun and allowed the students to use the stun gun. I asked Mr. Harbal what the students used the stun gun on, as in a punching bag or something else. Mr. Harbal advised the students used them on themselves. Mr. Harbal was asked if Ofc. Corbin used the stun gun on the kids or if the kids used them on themselves. Mr. Harbal advised the teacher stated Ofc. Corbin used the stun gun on the kids. Mr. Harbal further advised he had already spoke with Ofc. Corbin about the incident/complaint. Mr. Harbal stated Ofc. Corbin told him that she used the stun gun on the students. I asked Mr. Harbal how many students were in the class with him stating he believed around twelve (12). I asked how many were stunned by the stun gun. Mr. Harbal advised he knew of one student, but possibly two. I advised Mr. Harbal I would be in contact with him further about the situation. At that time, I advised Chief Donald of the phone call with Mr. Harbal.

May 20, 2021

I saw Mr. Harbal at the PHS evacuation drill. We began to speak about the incident. Mr. Harbal advised he spoke more with the teacher who said she was not comfortable with Ofc. Corbin showing and using a stun gun in the class. I asked Mr. Harbal if he knew if Ofc. Corbin used the stun gun on the students or if the students used it on themselves. Mr. Harbal advised the teacher explained that Ofc. Corbin used the stun gun on the students. I asked Mr. Harbal about the class and who set everything up. Mr. Harbal advised in the past few years, Robb Parthemore was the instructor for the class. He further advised the participates were girls from the Senior class. I asked Mr. Harbal if he had found out how many girls were stunned with the stun gun. He advised there were two female students. I asked Mr. Harbal if they were both eighteen (18) years old with him stating he would have to double check. Mr. Harbal expressed his concerns with the fact that Ofc. Corbin brought a stun gun to the class and possibly used it with students. Mr. Harbal advised he had already spoken with Mr. Boggs about the situation. Mr. Harbal was advised I would speak with Chief Donald about the matter. Mr. Harbal was further advised if they had to handle the situation from the school's standpoint, to handle it and we would handle things from the police department standpoint. Mr. Harbal stated he would be in contact with me if he found out anything further. Prior to the end of the conversation, Mr. Harbal stated he felt like Ofc. Corbin kind of, "blew him off" about the incident when he spoke with her yesterday.

Later in the day, I spoke with Chief Donald. It was decided I would speak to Ofc. Corbin about the incident. I spoke with Mr. Harbal to let him know I would be speaking with Ofc. Corbin about everything in the afternoon. Mr. Harbal advised he was speaking with Mr. Boggs again about the situation and had concerns. I asked Mr. Harbal if he found out about the two students with him stating one of the females is eighteen (18) years old and the other is seventeen (17). I asked Mr. Harbal again about who used the stun gun. Mr. Harbal advised he was ninety-five (95) percent he was told Ofc.

Corbin used the stun gun on the two students. I advised Mr. Harbal I would be in contact with him if there was further.

I spoke with Ofc. Corbin on afternoon shift (she was working overtime). At the beginning of the conversation, I told Ofc. Corbin, I wanted to speak to her with her stating it was about the incident with the stun gun. I began by asking her about the class. Ofc. Corbin advised this class has been put on every year for the female students in the Senior class since she was working with Dan McLaughlin except for last year due to COVID. I advised Ofc. Corbin, I was advised Robb Parthemore has been instructing the class the past few years. Ofc. Corbin advised that was correct, but she has been helping with the class every year. Ofc. Corbin advised she was approached by the teacher who asked her to instruct a women's self defense class. Ofc. Corbin advised this class was originally set up for Monday, 05/17/2021, but Ofc. Corbin was off that day. Ofc. Corbin stated the class got moved to Wednesday, 05/19/2021 at 0930 hrs. Ofc. Corbin advised she contacted the teacher at approximately 0815 hrs. on Wednesday to confirm the class was still on for 0930 hrs. Ofc. Corbin stated the teacher told her it was at 0830 hrs. and asked if Ofc. Corbin could still teach. Ofc. Corbin advised she could and responded to the teacher's room at the high school.

Ofc. Corbin advised she started the class by talking to the students about where they were going to college and situational awareness. Ofc. Corbin was asked how many students were in the class. Ofc. Corbin advised there were only five due to it being Senior skip day. Ofc. Corbin further advised the teacher also participated with the students. Ofc. Corbin advised as the class moved along, she showed the students different defense weapons that could be carried by a female. Ofc. Corbin advised one of those defense weapons was a stun gun. Ofc. Corbin stated the stun gun was a working flashlight, so no one knows it is a stun gun. I asked if it was a working stun gun with Ofc. Corbin confirming it did work. Ofc. Corbin advised she showed the stun gun to the students. She turned it on and clicked the button to make it spark. Ofc. Corbin advised at the end of class, the students were asking about the stun gun. Ofc. Corbin stated the students asked if she (Ofc. Corbin) would use the stun gun on them so they knew how it felt. Ofc. Corbin advised she told the students she would not use the stun gun on them. Ofc. Corbin further advised one of the students stated she was going into the military after high school, so she wanted to know what it felt like before she left. Ofc. Corbin stated the student asked if she could use the stun gun on herself. Ofc. Corbin advised she could and gave her the stun gun. Ofc. Corbin advised she had the student sit in a chair in the classroom. Ofc. Corbin stated the student turned the stun gun on and used it on her thigh. Ofc. Corbin stated another student asked if they could do the same to themselves. Ofc. Corbin advised the student she could, and the stun gun was handed to that student. Ofc. Corbin stated the student sat in the chair and attempted to do the same as the previous student. Ofc. Corbin advised the student's clothing got in the way and the student was not able to feel anything from the stun gun. Ofc. Corbin stated it was at that time she took the stun gun back.

I began to speak with Ofc. Corbin about the overall class. I asked her if she had completed an outline for the class. Ofc. Corbin stated she did not, and she just went off what has been taught in the past classes. I asked Ofc. Corbin if all the students were eighteen (18) with her stating she believe they were all of age. I asked Ofc. Corbin if there were any juveniles in the class, and if so, did she or anyone obtain any parental consent forms. Ofc. Corbin stated that would have been something done by the teacher. I advised Ofc. Corbin, at the beginning of the conversation she stated she knew I wanted to speak to her about the incident with the stun gun. I asked Ofc. Corbin how she knew this with her stating she had already spoken with Mr. Harbal. I asked Ofc. Corbin what took place. Ofc. Corbin stated

after the class, she went to the office to speak with Mr. Harbal about the incident with the stun gun. Ofc. Corbin advised when she got to the office, she saw that the teacher who set up the self defense class with her was already in Mr. Harbal's office with the door closed. Ofc. Corbin stated she figured the teacher was speaking with Mr. Harbal about the incident, and she did not want to interrupt so she did not open the door.

Ofc. Corbin advised she went back to Mr. Harbal's office later in the day. Ofc. Corbin advised she spoke with Mr. Harbal and Mr. Davie about the incident. Ofc. Corbin stated Mr. Harbal asked if she used the stun gun on the students. Ofc. Corbin advised Mr. Harbal, she did not even though the students asked her to use it on them. Ofc. Corbin further advised she did give the stun gun to the students and explained that the two students used it on themselves.

I spoke with Ofc. Corbin and she was advised these types of classes need to be approved by either myself and/or Chief Donald. I further advised Ofc. Corbin, she needs to have some form of outline to show what is being taught/presented.

Sergeant Adams:

Here is a timeline of events from this past week.

5/19

9:40 am - Mrs. DeRose Smith came to my office panicked regarding what took place during her senior self-defense class that just ended. Through this conversation, she mentioned that during this self-defense training Officer Tonya used a stun gun against her wishes. Mrs. DeRose said that she repeated multiple times that she is not ok with this when the first student was about to be stunned. As a second student asked to be stunned, Officer Tonya turned to Mrs. DeRose and said you can leave now. Mrs. DeRose said she was not leaving her students and she was not ok with stunning students with a stun gun.

1:30 Mr. Harbal met with Officer Tonya regarding the incident. During this conversation Officer Tonya indicated this wasn't a big deal. Mr. Harbal mentioned to Officer Tonya that this is the type of thing that can end up on the

news. During this conversation, Mr. Harbal asked who administered the stun gun on the students and Officer Tonya replied that the students used them on themselves.

5/20

7:40 Mrs. DeRose stopped down to inquire about the incident the previous day. During this conversation, Mrs. DeRose was asked who administered the stun gun to the student. Mrs. DeRose replied that Officer Tonya used them on both students.

5/24

12:15 - Mr. Harbal talked to both students involved in the incident on 5/19. The students were spoken to by themselves at a separate time. Both students indicated Officer Tonya used the stun gun on them and that they did not use it on themselves.

Tonya Corbin interview

May 26, 2001

Present: Chief Vince Donald and John Coppeler

Jackie Wegman, Joe Rotuno, and Tonya Corbin

The interview began at approximately 10:00 a.m. Tonya Corbin was presented with a Garrity warning by Chief Donald. She said she can read it, and she signed it.

Jackie Wegman raised a question about the Chief doing an interview which could lead to disciplinary proceedings. Her point was that a grievance would have to be submitted to the Chief under the contract bargaining agreement, and it was pointed out that we could agree to go directly to arbitration and bypass the Chief.

Tonya Corbin stated that a teacher had contacted her regarding putting on a self-defense or awareness presentation for senior girls at Perkins High School as had been done every year. The teacher was identified as Shannon DeRose.

Tonya stated that the presentation was originally scheduled for May 17, but Tonya would not be there that day so it was moved to May 19. It was to be at 9:30 a.m. but the teacher had called and moved it to 8:30 a.m. According to Tonya, there were five students in the classroom, all seniors, who are ages 17 and 18.

Tonya said she has done these presentations in the past with Chief Parthemore and Dan McLaughlin. She said this presentation was done every year except 2000, due to Covid.

She stated that she was telling the girls to be aware of their surroundings and how to get out of holds.

She said she was not aware of outlines for prior classes. She did not know whether there were outlines or not, as she was an assistant for those presentations.

Asked whether any weapons were used in those past presentations, Tonya answered that at times in the past, fake or rubber knives were used.

She said she did not know if Sgt. Adams was aware she was teaching that class. She acknowledged that the Chief was "probably not" aware that she was. She said there was no written outline, but the outline was in her head.

The teacher said she did not want anyone to be a victim. Tonya stated that she took in "tools" they could take to college with them. She said that there was a cue baton, breakaway, mace canister, a pen that could be used to stab someone which takes their DNA, a necklace, a stun gun, a door wedge, a purse with concealment pockets, and a canister with a bottom that could be unscrewed to put valuables in.

As she was making her presentation and showing these “tools” the teacher was looking each item up on Amazon and told the kids where they could find them.

Tonya said she explained the stun gun was also a flashlight. She said the stun gun is for pain compliance, and you have to get close to someone to make it work. She said a girl wanted to use the stun gun but Tonya told her no. She said that the student said she was going into the military and wanted to know what it was like, and the kids in the class said “come on” at the time. She said she set the stun gun on the table, and this girl came over, grabbed it, and used it on her own leg, discharging it for less than one second.

Tonya said that a second girl tried the stun gun on herself but it “didn’t connect” because of the material of the pants she was wearing.

Asked why she did not take the stun gun from the first student, her response was “I just wasn’t thinking.”

After the first student had the stun gun used on her, the teacher said “We are not going to do this” but, according to Tonya, the teacher continued to sit at her desk. Tonya denied telling the teacher she could leave the room.

Tonya said that “both kids stunned themselves.” Asked by the Chief “at no point did you stun them?” her response was “No.”

Tonya said that she talked to Mr. Harbal later in the day. She said he was in a meeting when class was over and she did not want to interrupt him at that time.

Tonya said that the teacher could see everything that was going on. Asked if the teacher could see the kids stun themselves, Tonya’s answer was “Yes.”

Asked why she left the stun gun on the table at all with kids asking to use the stun gun, her response was she set it down and the girl came up, sat on a chair, and reached out and grabbed in the stun gun and used it.

Tonya said that she wanted to tell Mr. Harbal what happened in class. He asked why she brought the stun gun to class.

Tonya concluded the interview by stating “I did not stun them; No.”

- 7) That I am granted immunity, and that neither my statements, nor any information or evidence gained by reason of this interview can be used against me in any subsequent criminal proceedings.

May 27, 2021

Present for the meeting: Vince Donald, Joe Rotuno, Tonya Corbin, Jackie Wegman (via phone), Ashley Ohlemacher

Meeting began at 12:51pm in Chief Donald's office.

Chief Donald (CD) called Jackie Wegman and Jackie stated we were meeting to get clarification from Tonya (TC) on her statement from yesterday. Jackie asked to make sure Tonya was still under Garrity. Chief Donald stated she was. Jackie then advised Tonya to begin speaking. The conversation went as follows:

TC - There were lots of emotions yesterday, after the meeting I left the building, went on a drive to think about everything to make sure I was not missing anything. I wanted to clarify I did not stun the second girl. I touched her with the stun gun, and it did not go off. I did touch her leg with the gun, but her pants were bunched up.

CD – You touched her leg, but the stun gun never went off?

TC – The first girl did it all by herself. The second girl had the stun gun on her leg, it did not connect, and did not stun her.

CD – Asked for clarification on how the second girl was stunned.

TC – I put the gun on her pants and it didn't go through.

TC – Gave a demonstration on Joe's leg on how the incident occurred and how the student's pants were bunched up. I put the stun gun on her leg, showed where she could get stunned.

CD – “Was it deployed on her leg?”

TC – “Yes, but it didn't go through.”

CD – “So you deployed the gun?”

TC – “Yes, I pulled the trigger, but it did not go through.”

Meeting ended at 12:57pm

Chief Donald,

On May 27, 2021, I responded to Perkins High School and spoke with the teacher and three of the students who were in the self defense class instructed by Ofc. Corbin. The first person I spoke with was the teacher, Shana DeRose. The second was an eighteen (18) year old student, [REDACTED]. The third was a seventeen (17) year old student, [REDACTED], who was stunned. The last person I spoke with was an eighteen (18) year old student, [REDACTED], who was also stunned. It should be noted, the students I spoke with were advised they were not in any trouble.

Shana DeRose

When I first started speaking with Shana, she advised Chief Parthemore had been instructing the self defense class for approximately the last eight (8) to ten (10) years. Shana advised usually the class takes place in the auxiliary gym, but this year, Ofc. Corbin advised they would stay in Shana's room (602). Shana further advised Ofc. Corbin brought in a bag with self defense weapons. Shana stated she was familiar that Ofc. Corbin has sold self defense weapons in the past but did not make any inclination that Ofc. Corbin was trying to sell any of the products to the students. Shana further stated during the class, Ofc. Corbin began to pull out some of the weapons to show the class. Shana advised Ofc. Corbin pulled out a mace canister, a tactical pen, and a few other items. Shana stated Ofc. Corbin asked the class if they knew what the items were. Shana advised the students were familiar with the items as they had done a safety project/power point presentation prior to Ofc. Corbin instructing the self defense class. Shana stated Ofc. Corbin pulled out an unknown item from the bag. Shana advised Ofc. Corbin showed the class and told them the item was a stun gun. Shana further advised Ofc. Corbin explained to the class that the stun gun emits something equivalent to a 9-volt battery. Shana stated Ofc. Corbin asked the class if anyone wanted to try the stun gun at which time [REDACTED] volunteered. Shana explained Ofc. Corbin told [REDACTED] to have a seat in the chair that was in front of Ofc. Corbin. Shana stated up to that point in the class, the kids were learning in a "laid back" environment. Shana further stated she believed Ofc. Corbin was just kidding about stunning [REDACTED]. Shana advised she even told Ofc. Corbin, "You can't do that to a student." Shana stated Ofc. Corbin put the stun gun up to [REDACTED] leg/thigh and triggered the stun gun. When asked, Shana advised Ofc. Corbin was the one holding the stun gun and she never gave the stun gun to [REDACTED].

Shana advised after Ofc. Corbin triggered the stun gun, another student, [REDACTED], wanted to volunteer to be stunned. Shana told [REDACTED] "No." Shana explained Ofc. Corbin moved on with the class. Shana further explained [REDACTED] continued to ask Shana if she could volunteer to be stunned. Shana advised she continued to tell [REDACTED] she could not be stunned. Shana stated at one point after [REDACTED] asked to volunteer, Ofc. Corbin said, "Maybe Ms. DeRose needs to go for a walk." Shana advised she was not going to leave her room especially after Ofc. Corbin stunned [REDACTED]. Shana stated [REDACTED] continued to ask until it was getting to the end of the period. Shana advised Ofc. Corbin said, "O, just come here" to [REDACTED]. Shana explained [REDACTED] sat in a chair, and Ofc. Corbin put the stun gun to [REDACTED] leg/thigh area. Shana advised Ofc. Corbin triggered the stun gun on [REDACTED] before the bell rang. Shana confirmed [REDACTED] did not hold or touch the stun gun. It should be noted, Mr. Harbal sat with us while Shana and I spoke about the incident.

[REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was advised of the situation. She was further advised I wanted to speak with her mainly about the stun gun with her stating she understood. [REDACTED] advised Ofc. Corbin showed the students the stun gun. [REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] asked if she could try the stun gun at which time Ofc. Corbin had [REDACTED] sit in a chair. [REDACTED] stated Ofc. Corbin asked [REDACTED] if she wanted to use the stun gun on herself. [REDACTED] told Ofc. Corbin, she did not, and she wanted Ofc. Corbin to use the stun gun on her. [REDACTED] advised Ofc. Corbin put the stun gun up to [REDACTED] leg/thigh and triggered the stun gun. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] moved a little bit and used the "F-word".

[REDACTED] advised toward the end of the class, [REDACTED] asked to be stunned. [REDACTED] stated Ofc. Corbin had [REDACTED] sit in a chair, and Ofc. Corbin asked if [REDACTED] wanted to use the stun gun on herself. [REDACTED] advised she did not, at which time Ofc. Corbin put the stun gun to [REDACTED] leg/thigh and triggered the stun gun. [REDACTED] confirmed neither [REDACTED], nor [REDACTED] held the stun gun, and it was Ofc. Corbin who triggered the stun gun on both students. When asked, [REDACTED] stated Ms. DeRose was very anxious about the matter. She further stated she did not remember what and/or anything that Ms. DeRose said to Ofc. Corbin and vice versa.

When I first started speaking with [REDACTED] I explained to her I was there to talk to her about the incident that happened in the self defense class. [REDACTED] was asked if she could explain to me what occurred with the stun gun. [REDACTED] advised Ofc. Corbin showed the class a flashlight that "doubled" as a stun gun. [REDACTED] explained Ofc. Corbin asked if there were any volunteers. [REDACTED] advised she volunteered due to her going into the military after high school and knew she was already going to get tased. [REDACTED] further advised she decided she wanted to find out what it felt like before she went to the military. [REDACTED] explained Ofc. Corbin had her sit in a chair and asked if she wanted to use the stun gun on herself. [REDACTED] stated she wanted Ofc. Corbin to use the stun gun on her. [REDACTED] advised Ofc. Corbin put the stun gun up to her leg/thigh. [REDACTED] stated Ms. DeRose expressed concern about Ofc. Corbin using the stun gun on [REDACTED] with Ofc. Corbin assuring Ms. DeRose it was fine. [REDACTED] stated Ofc. Corbin "administered" the stun gun to her leg/thigh. When asked, [REDACTED] advised Ofc. Corbin also used the stun gun on [REDACTED] toward the end of class. I asked [REDACTED] if she or [REDACTED] touched or used the stun gun at any time. [REDACTED] confirmed she did not touch or use the stun gun. [REDACTED] advised she did not believe [REDACTED] touched the stun gun and confirmed [REDACTED] did not use the stun gun.

[REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was advised I was there to speak with her about the stun gun incident while she was in the self defense class with her stating she understood. [REDACTED] explained Ofc. Corbin showed the class the stun gun which looked like a flashlight. [REDACTED] advised Ofc. Corbin asked for volunteers to be stunned. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] volunteered. [REDACTED] explained the same as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], that Ofc. Corbin was the one who used the stun gun on [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised she asked Ms. DeRose for permission to volunteer with Ms. DeRose telling her, "No." [REDACTED] stated at the end of the class, she asked Ofc. Corbin if she could volunteer. Ofc. Corbin asked [REDACTED] if she wanted to use the stun gun on herself. [REDACTED] advised Ofc. Corbin that she did not and wanted Ofc. Corbin to use the stun gun on her. [REDACTED] stated Ofc. Corbin had her sit in a chair. Ofc. Corbin then put the stun

gun to her leg/thigh. [REDACTED] explained Ofc. Corbin was the one who triggered the stun gun on [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] confirmed neither she nor [REDACTED] used the stun gun. She further confirmed Ofc. Corbin was the one who used the stun gun on the two students.

It should be noted, Mr. Davie sat with me while I spoke with Kamryn, [REDACTED], and [REDACTED]. Also, I was not able to speak with the other two students who were in the self defense class due to the cookout and practice graduation that was taking place.

I asked Officer Corbin to present to my AP Literature class, a class of eight girls, about safety on college campus and self-defense. This is something I have done for a number of years. In year's past Chief Parthemore has done this presentation in our auxiliary gym. He has brought in bag for kids to hit and our students have practiced self-defense moves under his supervision.

On May 19th, I only had 5 of my of 8 students due to it being "Senior Skip Day." Officer Tanya began the lesson by going over things the girls could do to keep themselves safe. I shared with her the Powerpoint presentation that our students put together regarding campus safety. She then proceeded to take out a bag to show the girls various items that they can carry with them on campus to keep themselves safe. Many of these items were in the girls' presentation, so they were already familiar with most of them. We discussed each item as she took them out of the bag. She then took out something and asked if we knew what it was. We didn't. She said it was a stun gun and it emits a a shock something akin to a 9 volt battery. She then asked if anyone wanted to try it. I, as well as the girls, thought she was kidding. I told her that I didn't think she could do that to a student. When one girl volunteered, I said to Off. Corbin: "You can't do that" and "You're not really going to do that, are you?"

At this point, I felt a little uneasy, but I figured she was just joking with the girls as she is our School Resource Officer and familiar with our kids. When ██████████ stepped forward as a volunteer, she had her sit in a seat where she then used the device on her. It emitted a loud "zapping" sound and we were all surprised. At this point, I was visibly upset. When another girl wanted to volunteer, I vehemently said, "NO!" as I was not comfortable with this. ██████████ then told the other girls it "wasn't a big deal" and that it "didn't hurt." We then moved on to practicing self defense moves. During this time, the other student kept pleading with me to let Officer Tanya use the device on her. I repeatedly said "NO." Officer Corbin told the girls, "maybe Mrs. DeRose needs to take a walk."

I did not feel comfortable leaving my room. We continued with the lesson by practicing self defense moves. ██████████ kept pleading and by the conclusion of the class, Officer Corbin called ██████████ up to her and said, "Oh c'mon, just come here" and at this point, I felt powerless as I had already voiced my disapproval. She then used the device on ██████████ and ██████████ concurred with ██████████ regarding its use. The class ended a minute after this. As soon as the bell rang, I immediately reported this incident to my principal, Mr. Harbal.

You were previously placed on paid administrative leave relating to your conduct on May 19, 2021 while conducting a "self defense" class for Perkins High School female students where you took a stun gun and other weapons into the classroom and two of the students in the class were stunned or attempted to be stunned. In subsequent questioning about the event, you provided various explanations on more than one occasion, which it appears from the investigation that the Department conducted were false.

Accordingly, you are charged with the following:

- (1) Misfeasance in Office, generally
- (2) Violation of Policy 162, the Conducted Electrical Weapons Policy
- (3) Violation of Policy 201, and specifically Section 201.2, prohibiting false statements, Section 201.3 prohibiting incompetent performance and misfeasance, and Section 201.4 requiring employees to always display absolute honesty.

You shall remain on paid leave pending a pre-disciplinary hearing to be held on 6/11, 2021 at 1600. Until that time, you remain ordered to not come to the Police Department nor to contact any persons involved in the event you conducted at the school or connected with the subsequent investigation of the event.
